

# Download Rigging A C Scow Sailboat

A scow is a flat-bottomed type of sailboat. During the 19th and early 20th centuries, scows were used to carry cargo in coastal waters and inland waterways, having the advantage when navigating shallow water or serving small harbours. As the C Scow Class President, Ed was invited up to Melges in Lake Geneva, WI for the first sail of the new 2013 C Scow. We have a 1998 C currently and it's a great boat...but we'll be looking to upgrade soon! We had a beautiful late Fall afternoon...crisp, medium breeze and a little bit of sun here and there. The MC-Scow is a 16 ft (4.9 m) one-design sailboat made by Melges Performance Sailboats. The boat is cat rigged, and is sailed by either one or two people.. History. In the 1960s, Johnson Boat Works introduced the J-Scow as its new boat. The boat had a hull similar in size and shape to the M Scow but sporting only a mainsail and no jib.
